Health Sciences Recruitment & Admissions

- As of September 2024, all incoming Fall 2025 Health Sciences program students will be required to complete admission prerequisite coursework by June 30, 2025. Aligned with Norman Campus' incoming student deadline, this adjustment is to ensure the processing of student records, confirm enrollment prior to orientation and first day of classes, ensure financial aid disbursement, and student health insurance access. If an admitted student is unable to complete admission requirements by June 30, 2025, students can submit a Prerequisite Waiver. - An Academic Calendar Exception has been made for the fall semester of the second professional program year (P2) beginning with the 2026-27 term (Class of 2029). The exception will allow a second year (P2) pharmacy student fall semester start date that is two weeks earlier than the customary start date for didactic courses. This exception will facilitate P2 student completion of a required 2-week/80-hour community clinical rotation in association with the Pharmacy Practice III course prior to the start of all fall semester didactic coursework.*
