

According to the most recent Bureau of Labor statistics, pharmacists in Oklahoma have an average starting salary of \$127,050.

The pharmacy profession is expected to grow at a rate of 5% over the next 10 years.



SUMMARY

The Hudson College of Public Health (HCOPH) provides quality graduate and professional education for both public health practice professionals and research scientists. One of only 67 accredited schools of public health in the U.S. and the only CEPHaccredited school of public health in Oklahoma, HCOPH prepares students for public health practice in the core areas of Biostatistics & Epidemiology, Health Administration & Policy, Health Promotion Sciences, and Occupational & Environmental Health.



INTRODUCTION

Public Health is the science and practice of protecting and improving the health of people and communities. Major focuses are: preventing disease, promoting healthy practices, and prolonging life through education, research, and policy-making. Our graduates work in many roles across the public and private sectors.

Biostatisticians:

Apply statistical methods to health research, design studies, analyze data, and interpret results to inform scientific understanding and policy decisions (Think: NIH, Gates Foundation, WHO).

Epidemiologists:

Study patterns, causes, and effects of health practices and diseases in populations. They help prevent illness and control outbreaks (Think: CDC, OSDH, Pfizer, Gilead).

Community Health Workers:

Frontline health professionals who serve as the bridge between communities and healthcare systems through education and outreach, advocacy, health data reporting, and much more (Think: TSET, WIC, Mental Health First Aid).

Healthcare **Executives:**

Manage health systems to maintain and improve quality care, monitor patient outcomes, manage finances and budgets, and ensure compliance with laws/regulations (Think: Hospital CEOs, Program Directors).

Occupational/ **Environmental Health Scientists:**

Air/water quality specialists, manufacturing safety managers, food safety specialists, industrial hygienists (Think: EPA, OSHA, Texas Instruments, Boeing).


FACTS

- Allied Health contains ~18 programs, with 9 leading directly to licensure.
 This includes undergraduate, professional, and graduate students all in the same building.
- Programs are highly competitive, so grades will play a large factor in the decision process. The Kira Talent interview is a great way to help an applicant further stand out.
- Many programs can be a great starting point for future goals, such as graduate studies or a career as an MD.





- Meeting minimum requirements does not often lead to a competitive application.
 - For more competitive programs (Sonography, PT, etc.), lower GPAs or scores will likely significantly hinder successful admission.
- Apply early!
 - Applicants can send updated transcripts at the end of the fall to update records, but there is no harm in submitting the application early to get it in the review process.
- Practice scenario-based interview questions
 - While questions will differ, getting used to answering these types of questions will help develop that skill.





HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE



1954

The OU Board of Regents authorized establishment of a dental college to respond to the underserved dental needs of Oklahomans.

1969

Two houses were acquired on 14th street, one devoted to the DH program and the other was devoted to the DDS program.

1971

Our first <u>16</u> dental hygienists graduate from the OU Dental Hygiene Program.

TODAY

Our program has increased the number of graduates to 52 per year.





CURRENT DENTAL HEALTH OF OKLAHOMA

- According to the Oklahoma Dental Loan Repayment Program, all 77 counties in the state are designated, either fully or partially, as dental Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs), and 11 counties have no practicing dentists at all.
 - In many of these areas, residents must travel at least thirty minutes to receive care, limiting both the frequency and extent of treatment. (great opportunity for students who want to work in rural Oklahomal.
- Oklahoma Oral Health Coalition's 2023 report card gave the state a grade of "D" for oral health, citing challenges such as low rates of preventive dental visits, limited sealant use, high levels of untreated caries and tooth loss, inadequate access to fluoridated water, and unmet needs within dental HPSAs.
- Additionally, Oklahoma consistently ranks in the bottom half of the fifty states in terms of oral health.



WHY ATTEND THE OU DENTAL HYGIENE PROGRAM?

- OU offers the only baccalaureate degree dental hygiene program in the State of Oklahoma!
- Comprehensive Care Clinics Our DH students simulate a private practice environment, allowing them to gain valuable experience working alongside dental students in a clinical setting.
- Our program has three (3) distance site locations across the state, allowing students an opportunity to join the program without needing to relocate to Oklahoma City – additional site locations are in Ardmore, Bartlesville and Weatherford.

















Figure 3: American Dental Association Health Policy Institute, "30-Minute Drive Access to Dental Care Score for All Populations by Block Group in Oklahoma"







Dentite's per 100 000 Population



HOW ARE ADMISSIONS DECISIONS MADE?

- Applications are screened for minimum requirements then given a complete review.
- Applicants chosen for an interview will be invited to an interview day where they will have a traditional 2:1 interview
 - Interviews are scored and returned to the Director of Admissions
 - Interview scores are kept confidential
- Applicants who have completed an interview have their applications reviewed by a member of the College of Dentistry's Admissions Committee
 - Admissions Committee members present each assigned application for discussion
 - The Admissions Committee decides on a ranking for that applicant based on this discussion, scoring is not tied to a specific ranking
 - Application review scores are kept confidential
- Applications are sorted by score within each ranking.

- 2. Science GPA
- Number of Completed Prerequisites
- Number of Science Courses Completed (Chemistry, Microbiology, Human Anatomy, Human Physiology)





INTERNATIONAL STUDENT APPLICANTS

- Evaluations are accepted from the World Education Services (WES) or the Educational Credential Evaluators (ECE).
- The LPN-BSN, RN-BSN, MSN, Post-Graduate Certificates, PhD, and DNP programs
 in the OU College of Nursing are hybrid and/or online programs. The F-1 visa
 regulations require in-person courses, and these programs do not meet those
 requirements. Thus, international students are not accepted for these programs
 (LPN-BSN, RN-BSN, MSN, Post-Graduate Certificates, PhD, and DNP). International
 students are only eligible to apply for the ABSN and TBSN pathways as they have
 in-person requirements.

- A fully accredited public medical school founded in 1900, based at the Oklahoma City Health Sciences Center. It stands as the only medical school in the state granting the M.D. degree.
- Offers two distinct MD tracks:
 - Oklahoma City (OU Health Campus):
 Traditional academic health center with access
 to 50+ specialties, the Stephenson Cancer
 Center (Oklahoma's sole NCI-designated cancer
 center), and a Level I trauma center.
 - School of Community Medicine (SCM) in Tulsa:
 A 4-year integrated track focused on community-based care and serving underserved populations.

 - A 27-month, fast-paced PA graduate program grounded in collaborative learning and professional development.

 - A 30-month PA program based in Tulsa with a strong primary care and community medicine focus.

- As of January 16, 2025, there were 12,064 active licensed MDs, with 7,049 actively practicing in Oklahoma.

- Approximately 32.7% of Oklahoma MDs are within retirement range, significantly impacting future supply.








- The Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant (ARC-PA) has granted Accreditation-Continued status to the University of Oklahoma Physician Associate Program. The approximate date for the next validation review of the program by the ARC-PA will be September 2034.
- PAs are vital to modern healthcare because they extend the reach of physicians, improve patient access, and offer cost-effective care.
- PAs increase access to healthcare services by extending the reach of physicians, especially in areas with shortages or long wait times.

PA WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT STATISTICS

- The number of board-certified PAs in the US reached 189,907 by the end of 2024, representing a 27.8% increase over the last five years.
- The profession is projected to grow by 28% from 2023 to 2033, which is significantly faster than the average growth rate for all occupations.
- PAs work in a wide array of healthcare settings, including hospitals (48.4%), physician offices (33.1%), and outpatient care centers (14.3%).
- Top specialties include surgical subspecialties, family medicine, and emergency medicine.
- PAs are increasingly specializing, with occupational medicine and geriatrics seeing the highest rates of specialty change.

- Chemistry- 12 hours (General Chemistry or above with lab as required for science majors. Three hours must be Organic Chemistry or Biochemistry.)

The following must be completed within the last 7 years:

- Physiology– 4 hours (with lab)
- Anatomy- 4 hours (with lab)
- Upper division science (Must be 3000 or 4000 level. Courses may include Genetics, Immunology, Virology, Cell Biology, Molecular Biology, Embryology, Histology, Pathogenic Microbiology.
- All prerequisites must be completed with a grade of "C" or better








All applicants are evaluated the same, regardless of their background, including international applicants. However, the following steps must be completed by international applicants to be considered for admission:


Step 1: Have all international transcripts evaluated by WES (World Education Services) or ECE (Educational Credential Evaluators).

• When going through WES, you should have the Course-by-Course Report and WES ICAP package, and when going through ECE, you should have the Course-by-Course Report.


Step 2: Determine if you need to take the TOEFL.

 All September 1st deadline requirements still apply for those who have to meet the TOEFL requirement. You must submit the TOEFL by September 1st or have an approved waiver in your file by September 1st. Contact the Office of Recruitment and Admissions for further information.




